Study Space, Meeting Rooms & Tech Help

Please note, for your convenience, we now offer online self-serve meeting and study room reservations on our website www.northlibertylibrary.org (under Quick Links near the bottom left-hand side of our homepage).

Study Rooms

We have three study rooms devoted to quiet study. Reserve online, walk in or call ahead. Please allow up to 24 hours for confirmation for online reservations. Space can be reserved for up to a three-hour block.

Meeting Rooms

We have a large meeting space that is broken down into four smaller meeting rooms available for non-profit use. Reserve a meeting room online or by calling the library. Please allow up to 24 hours for confirmation for online reservations. Meeting rooms cannot be used for individual/private parties such as weddings, showers, reunions or birthdays. The North Liberty Recreation Center, ph. 626.5716, has fee-based meeting space available for for-profit purposes.

You will need your library card with patron ID number found on the back. Go to our website www.northlibertylibrary.org and click on the Reference tab. Select Digital Johnson County, RB Digital or TumbleBooks for eBooks/eMedia, or desired database, log in if prompted and go!

Policy, Procedures, and Special Services

FACILITY AGE REQUIREMENT

The North Liberty Community Center has a minimum age requirement of 6th grade (11-12 years old) for patrons using the facility without caregiver supervision. A school ID will be required or a facility pass from the Recreation Department in the event that your school does not offer IDs. Please see the building policy if you have questions.

PHOTOGRAPHY PERMISSION

The North Liberty Library may be taking photos at library sponsored programs for marketing purposes. Your participation in the program signifies your permission.

FOOD ALLERGY NOTICE

On occasion, food items may be offered at library programs that contain allergens. If you have concerns, please check with staff for a list of items. Parents are encouraged to bring alternative snacks to these events.

SPECIAL EVENT HOURS

For special programs and events that are scheduled outside of normal library business hours: doors to the library will open 15 minutes prior to the event. Keep in mind that no other library services will be offered at these times.

NOTARY SERVICES

Notary is a service available free of charge. The library now has two notaries on staff. Please call the library to ensure availability. Valid photo ID is required for each person listed on document(s) being notarized.

HOMEBOUND PATRONS

The library offers a delivery program for patrons who are not able to visit the library because of a temporary or permanent disability. This service is free. Contact the library for more information or to request materials.

PROGRAM REGISTRATION

The library is now using Eventbrite for program registration. Larger programs with no limit on registration will open the 1st Monday of the new brochure (January, May, September). Although registration will not be limited you must register so we can plan space/supplies accordingly. Programs with limited registration will open the Monday of the week prior to the event. Hosted events where the presenter requires payment will take place via presenter's website (ex. Tinted Vintage), etc. If you register for a program that you are later unable to attend, please let us know or cancel your reservation on Eventbrite.
